Shawn Mayle Sentenced to Six Months in Prison

ATHENS, OHIO—December 10, 2013— Athens County Prosecuting Attorney Keller Blackburn announced today that Shawn Mayle will spend six (6) months in prison.

Shawn Mayle, age 31, of Chauncey, Ohio appeared before Judge L. Alan Goldsberry and pled guilty to one (1) count of Vandalism, a fifth degree felony and one (1) count of Resisting Arrest, a second degree misdemeanor. Judge Goldsberry sentenced Mayle to six (6) months in prison to run consecutive to a prior conviction.

Prosecutor Blackburn says, "Shawn Mayle pled guilty to one (1) count of Vandalism, a fifth degree felony and one (1) count of Resisting Arrest, a second degree misdemeanor and Judge Goldsberry sentenced him to six (6) months in prison. In July, the Athens County Sheriff's Office was contacted by the Muskinghum County Sheriff's Office to please locate Shawn Mayle. Mayle had a warrant for his arrest for receiving stolen property in Muskinghum County. When two Sheriff Deputies went to Mayle's residence he did not comply with the law enforcement verbal and physical commands and began pulling and kicking at the law enforcement officers. Mayle was handcuffed and placed inside the marked cruiser. Once secured inside the vehicle, Mayle kicked out the rear passenger glass. Within twelve (12) months of his release from prison, Mayle is to pay restitution in the amount of \$357.68 to the Athens County Sheriff's Office."

This case was investigated by the Athens County Sheriff's Office.
