Tylor Woodrum Will Spend Six Years in Prison

ATHENS, OHIO—December 11, 2013— Athens County Prosecuting Attorney Keller Blackburn announced today that Tylor Woodrum will spend six (6) years in prison.

Tylor Woodrum, age 23, of Nelsonville, Ohio appeared before Judge L. Alan Goldsberry and pled guilty to three cases:

- 1. One (1) count of Trespass in a Habitation, a fourth degree felony; one (1) count of Safecracking, a fourth degree felony; and one (1) count of Illegal Assembly or Possession of Chemicals for the Manufacture of Drugs, a third degree felony.
- 2. One (1) count of Illegal Assembly or Possession of Chemicals for the Manufacture of Drugs, a second degree felony.
- 3. One count of Illegal Assembly or Possession of Chemicals for the Manufacture of Drugs, a second degree felony.

Judge Goldsberry sentenced Woodrum to six (6) years in prison for all charges.

Prosecutor Blackburn says, "In May, 2013, Tylor Woodrum stole a safe from a neighbor's house and was attempting to break it open when the Nelsonville police were called. When the police arrived, they found the keys to the safe in Woodrum's possession and a book bag containing chemicals commonly used in manufacturing methamphetamine. On July 25, 2013, the Athens Police Department initiated a traffic stop at an Athens Speedway where Woodrum was found with ingredients commonly used in manufacturing methamphetamine. The next day, July 26, 2013, a search warrant was executed at Woodrum's residence at 11839 Ten Spot Road in Nelsonville where law enforcement officers found a back pack under an out building containing several tools and chemicals commonly used in manufacturing methamphetamine.

Today Judge Goldsberry sentenced Tylor Woodrum to a total of six (6) years for all charges."

These cases were investigated by the Nelsonville Police Department, Athens City Police Department, and Athens County Sheriff's Office.
