Community Control Agreement Turns to Prison after Glouster Man Fails to Appear for Initial Sentencing Hearing

Shane Curtis McKee, 24, of Glouster, Ohio, appeared on April 30, 2014, for the purpose of sentencing.

McKee previously entered a change of plea to guilty for an indictment charging one (1) count of Theft From an Elderly Person or Disabled Adult, a felony of the fourth degree. McKee failed to appear for a prior sentencing hearing on September 24, 2013 therefore violating the terms of his original plea agreement. The original plea agreement called for McKee to be placed on community control; however, due to his failure to appear, McKee will now serve ten (10) months in the State Penal System.

Prosecutor Blackburn reports that "on September 9, 2012, McKee did take items from the residence of an elderly individual on Morgan Street in Glouster without permission."

This case was investigated by the Glouster Police Department.
