Bradley D. Hairston, 23, of Nelsonville, Ohio, appeared before Judge George P. McCarthy on March 9, 2015, and entered a change of plea to guilty to an indictment charging two (2) counts of Aggravated Burglary, both felonies of the first degree for his role in the armed robbery of two individuals in Nelsonville, Ohio on November 8, 2014. Prosecutor Blackburn stated that “Hairston did set in motion a plan for in which his two co-Defendants did enter the residence of two (2) individuals without permission with guns, ordered the individuals to the ground and took property from the residence.”

Judge McCarthy sentenced Hairston to nine (9) years in the State Penal System. Hairston will complete five (5) years of mandatory post-release control upon his release from prison. Hairston will be required to pay restitution to the victim in this matter as well as \$350.00 toward his jail stay and Court costs.

William Stivison, 19, of Nelsonville, Ohio and Roshawn Waldren, 21, of Nelsonville, Ohio, Hairston’s co-Defendants are currently under indictments, each charged with two (2) counts of first degree Aggravated Burglary. Stivison is scheduled to appear before Judge Lang on March 19, 2015, for a pre-trial and Waldren is scheduled to appear before Judge McCarthy on March 18, 2015, for a pre-trial.

This case was investigated by the Nelsonville Police Department.
