Roshawn Treveze Waldren, 21, of Nelsonville, Ohio, appeared before Judge George P. McCarthy on March 18, 2015, for the purpose of a pretrial hearing. On that date, Waldren entered a change of plea to guilty to an indictment charging two (2) counts of Aggravated Burglary, both felonies of the first degree. Prosecutor Blackburn stated that “Waldren and two (2) other individuals were responsible for entering the residence of two (2) individuals without permission with guns, ordered the individuals to the ground and took property from the residence.”

Judge McCarthy sentenced Waldren to nine (9) years in prison. Upon his release, Waldren will be subject to five (5) years mandatory post-release control, will be required to pay Court costs as well as restitution to the victims in this case.

Bradley D. Hairston, 23, of Nelsonville, Ohio, was sentenced to nine (9) years in prison on March 9, 2015, for his role in this crime.

William Stivison, 19, of Nelsonville, Ohio Walden and Hairston’s co-Defendant is currently under indictment, charged with two (2) counts of first degree Aggravated Burglary. Stivison is scheduled to appear before Judge Lang on April 7, 2015, for a pre-trial.
